

Tips for Lilac Care from Heather Prince at the Growing Place

If you need to prune your lilacs, prune them as soon as flowers fade. You will probably want to remove the flower remnants. If your lilac is getting too big or too out of bounds, try renewal pruning. Remove one-third of the largest stems a couple of inches above the soil line. Lilacs respond well to hand pruning, but if the plant is the right size and shape for you, leave it alone.

Do not use a high nitrogen fertilizer around lilacs, as it can impede their flowering.

Lilacs hate wet feet and prefer good drainage. Once established, they do not require excess water unless there is a particularly severe drought.

Common lilacs love full sun, the more the better! However, Dwarf Korean and Chinese lilacs will bloom well in part shade.

In late summer you may see a powdery substance on the leaves of common lilacs. This is powdery mildew and is more of an aesthetic problem. You can treat it with a fungicide spray such as Safer, but treatment should begin as soon as you notice the problem.
