Made in America: Native Woodies for the Home Landscape - March Meeting

Our speaker in March was club favorite Dave Waninger from Klehm's Song Sparrow Farm in Janesville, Wisconsin (www.songsparrow.com). Dave first helped us understand that “native” means plants found naturally in our 7-county ecosystem. We saw examples of native trees, shrubs, and evergreens, pictured in various seasons, sizes, and cultivars. The slide show helped us envision placing these in our gardens. We also loved the beautiful Song Sparrow Farm catalogs Dave brought along to share with us. Lots of ideas for our gardens as spring slowly comes to northern Illinois.
