Jan Calhoun of Ball Floral Plant on "New Annuals"

For the second year in a row the club got a peek at some of the plants that will be coming to garden centers NEXT year, as Jan Calhoun brought new varieties from the Ball Gardens to share. With her daughter's assistance Jan showed off the best from Ball Flora Plant.

Many of the plants were designed with special uses in mind: a compact habit, longer lasting blooms, resistance to common problems like powdery mildew, unusual blooms or color combinations. What we saw of were some of the latest crop of "winners". Bidens Sun Kiss with its bright yellow blossoms which come early and last all season is a compact plant designed for small containers. The designer geraniums come in a profusion of color combinations. My favorite was Peppermint Twist.

Impatiens will be available in unique shapes,

YELLOW and an array of pinks and corals and fuchsias, and there are trailing, mini, and double blossoms (which look a lot like small roses) varieties. Quite an array of options in a plant that is basically easy to grow, hard to kill (as long as they are well-watered) and planted in the shade they love.

Jan also brought Iresine and Osteospermum (that almost indestructible daisy like plant that is planted along interstates out west), and verbena.

Keeping with her "no plant returns to the greenhouse" policy, the plants were given away by lottery at the end of the meeting. The first pick went to new member Naoka Malinowski and all the plants were quickly spoken for. Thanks to Jan, lots of lucky members now have a unique (for this year) plant in their gardens.




